## **Camping Equipment**

Tent ground pad sleeping bag

Most of our scouts bring a tent of their own and share with other scouts; if you do not have a tent the troop has about 5 tents in the troop trailer. You are welcome to use one if needed. No cots are allowed in the troop tents. We let the scouts pick their own tent partners but if someone is left as a single then we will move a few around to get people in tents together. No one sleeps alone in a tent unless they come to the leader and say that is how they prefer it. Parents should sleep in their own tents, scouts in their own tents.

MESS KIT The troop does not supply eating utensils. You will need a cup and a mess kit. If you do not have an actual mess kit then bring a plate, bowl, and silver ware. Not paper plates and plastic ware. We will be doing dishes.

Pocket knife, compass, if you have, if not start accumulating as birthday and x-mas gifts, etc.

Flashlight

First aid kit

toilet paper

toothbrush, etc
